Notes of Guidance on Completion of the Honywood School Mid-Year Application

1. This form should be completed and shared with your child's current/previous school who will provide information as detailed on page 3. The form should be sent directly to Honywood School for the attention of Miss Vandome.
2. You should be aware that there is no guarantee of a place at any school so you can and should apply for more than one school, unless you have established that your preferred schools definitely has a place for your child. To find out if there are places, please contact Miss Vandome at Honywood School on 01376 561231 or admissions@honywoodschool.com
3. Once the application is returned to the school, the school will write to you within 7 days to confirm if a place is offered or not. If you do not hear within this timescale, please contact the school directly to ask about your application.
4. If the school writes to you to offer a place, you should get in touch with the school to confirm if you are accepting the place and arrange a start date.
5. If you are refused a place, the letter you receive should explain that you have the right of appeal to an independent appeal panel against the decision. Appeals should be made in writing using the relevant form within 20 days of the refusal letter. Information about appealing is available on the website www.essex.gov.uk/admissions from the "Submit an Appeal" link.
6. Applying from overseas – for UK/EU citizens where the last school was overseas, you need to provide a copy of the passport to prove that the child is a UK/EU citizen. For non-EU citizens, the child must be in the UK before the application can be processed and proof of residency such as an endorsed (stamped) passport or entry visa will be required with the application.
7. If, having applied for a place, you do not manage to secure a school for your child (and you are living in the Essex County Council area* or have a confirmed move into the County), please contact School Admissions at Essex County Council on 0845 603 2200 for further support and advice. 8. Please remember – applications must be sent directly to Honywood School – **not Essex County Council.**

School Transport

Things to consider before changing school

Transport

How will your child get to a new school safely and on time? What will be the cost involved? In most cases you are unlikely to be eligible for help with the cost of transport if you have chosen to move your child from a local school.

If you have not moved house, you should not remove your child from his/her current school until you have secured a new school place. Your child should continue to attend the current school if it is within travelling distance.

The curriculum

Every school has a structured curriculum but different parts of it will be taught at different times of the year in each school.

Different books or periods of history may be studied, depending on the choices made by the school. For learners in Cohort 9, 10 and 11, will the GCSE subjects your child is studying still be available? There is no guarantee that options can be matched. For example, at Honywood School, our learners commence their GCSE studies in Cohort 9 and follow a three year GCSE programme.

Uniform

You may have to buy a complete set of new uniform if your child changes school. Have you considered the cost?
